Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Advent is an exciting time for children. They probably don't use the word "advent", but they know that Christmas will soon be here. They see the decorations, the lights, the toys all over the stores. That's a sure sign that Christmas is coming.



What about adults? Some people love Advent and they start to bake cookies, hang decorations and lights, go to and give parties, buy pretty dresses and ugly sweaters, go Christmas caroling, some still send Christmas cards while others send emails. Other people watch those busy people mentioned above and simply sit and wait for the Christ child and the beautiful Christmas Eve service at church. Advent is not so exciting for them.

Believe it or not, I'm in the second category. What do I do during Advent? I look for a new and uplifting, inspirational devotional. I'm always looking for a new and different way to present Advent to my congregation, you. It's an old story that everybody knows. Is there anything new I can share with all of you?

This year I discovered a new-to-me devotional called "Preparing for Christmas." It was written by a national bestselling author, Richard Rohr. ("Advent is not about a sentimental waiting for the Baby Jesus.") Father Richard Rohr is a Franciscan Priest who is a globally recognized ecumenical teacher bearing witness to the universal awakening within mystical and transformational traditions.

For the first Sunday in Advent he writes: "Keep awake therefore, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming." Matthew 24:42. Father Rohr, "'Come, Lord Jesus,' the Advent mantra, means that all of Christian history has to live out of a kind of deliberate

emptiness, a kind of chosen non-fulfillment. Perfect fullness is always to come, and we do not need to demand it now. This keeps the field of life wide open and especially open to grace and to a future created by God rather than ourselves. This is exactly what it means to be 'awake,' as the Gospel urges us! We can also use other a words for Advent: aware, alive, attentive, alert, awake are all appropriate! Advent is, above all us, a call to full consciousness and a forewarning about the high price of consciousness.

"When we demand satisfaction of one another, when we demand any completion to history on our terms, when we demand that our anxiety or any dissatisfaction be taken away, saying as it were, 'Why weren't you this for me? Why didn't life do that for me?' we are refusing to say, 'Come, Lord Jesus.' We are refusing to hold out for the *full picture* that is always given by God."

There is more to Father Rohr's view of this first Sunday of Advent lesson. If you would like a copy of "Preparing for Christmas" let me know. Joy and Peace as we enter Advent. Pastor Rosemary
