God gives us courage to help the most vulnerable in our world in the year to come.

GOSPEL READING: Matthew 2:1-12

2 After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in the territory of Judea during the rule of King Herod, magi came from the east to Jerusalem. ² They asked, "Where is the newborn king of the Jews? We've seen his star in the east, and we've come to honor him."

³ When King Herod heard this, he was troubled, and everyone in Jerusalem was troubled with him. ⁴ He gathered all the chief priests and the legal experts and asked them where the Christ was to be born. ⁵ They said, "In Bethlehem of Judea, for this is what the prophet wrote:

⁶ You, Bethlehem, land of Judah, by no means are you least among the rulers of Judah.

because from you will come one who governs, who will shepherd my people Israel."[a]

⁷Then Herod secretly called for the magi and found out from them the time when the star had first appeared. ⁸ He sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search carefully for the child. When you've found him, report to me so that I too may go and honor him." ⁹ When they heard the king, they went; and look, the star they had seen in the east went ahead

of them until it stood over the place where the child was. ¹⁰ When they saw the star, they were filled with joy. ¹¹ They entered the house and saw the child with Mary his mother. Falling to their knees, they honored him. Then they opened their treasure chests and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. ¹² Because they were warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they went back to their own country by another route."

Hear the ancient words revealed to us anew.

MESSAGE:

"Why is the visit by the Magi Significant?"

The story of the three Magi visiting Baby Jesus is only found in the Gospel of Matthew. In this month's newsletter I give some information on who the Magi were. Now we'll talk about the gifts they brought, as written by Rev. William Barclay.

"From very early times, the gifts the wise men brought have been seen as particularly fitting. Each gift has been seen as representing something which specially matched some characteristic of Jesus and his work.

(1) Gold is the gift of a king. Seneca, the Roman philosopher, tells us that in Parthia it was the

custom that no one could approach the king without a gift. And gold, the king of metals, is the fit gift for a king.

So, Jesus was the 'Man born to be King'. But he was to reign not by force but by love; and he was to rule over human hearts, not from a throne, but from a cross. We do well to remember that Jesus Christ is King. We can never meet Jesus on equal terms. We must always meet him on terms of complete submission. (As the saying goes, let go and let God.) Before we can be friends with Christ, we must submit to Christ.

(2) Frankincense is the gift for a priest. It was in the Temple worship and at the Temple sacrifices that the sweet perfume of frankincense was used. The function of a priest is to open the way to God for men and women. The Latin word for priest is pontifex, which means a bridge-builder. The priest is the one who builds a bridge between human beings and God.

That is what Jesus did. He opened the way to God; he made it possible for us to enter into the very presence of God.

(3) Myrrh is the gift for one who is to die. Myrrh was used to embalm the bodies of the dead. Jesus came into the world to die. Jesus also came into the world to live for men and women, and, in the end, to die for them. He came to give for us his life and his death.

"Gold for a king, frankincense for a priest, myrrh for one who was to die – these were the gifts of the wise men, and, even at the cradle of Christ, they foretold that he was to be the true king, the perfect high priest, and in the end the supreme Savior of the world"

I guess that's why we call them "Wise Men". They knew what the future would hold for this Baby, and they were preparing the Holy Family for the outcomes. And Jesus teaches us our future depending on what we believe and what we do. Amen

PASTORAL PRAYER: Beginning with a time for silent personal prayer.

God of the stars. God of the day and God of the night. We marvel at your creations in our world and in our lives. God created everything so that we may live to be servants to others. Jesus is our teacher, but

we have not always learned our lessons well. We have failed many times. Have mercy on us, gracious God.

There are many in the world who need so much; food, water, and shelter. Where do we begin to help? The food pantry is one place. Clothing drives is another. And we can financially help charities or volunteer to help these charities. We are not without ways to help. The blessings you have given each of us, dear Lord, we should share.

Another way to help is to pray for those people and others such as those on our prayer list. Bring your love and comfort to all as we share the prayer your son gave us . . .

THE LORD'S PRAYER: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be your name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
