

EPISTLE LESSON: Romans 5:1-5 THEREFORE, WE HAVE PEACE WITH GOD

5 Therefore, since we have been made righteous through his faithfulness, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. ² We have access by faith into this grace in which we stand through him, and we boast in the hope of God's glory. ³ But not only that! We even take pride in our problems, because we know that trouble produces endurance, ⁴ endurance produces character, and character produces hope. ⁵ This hope doesn't put us to shame, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

*GOSPEL LESSON: John 16:12-15 I STILL HAVE MANY THINGS TO SAY

¹² "I have much more to say to you, but you can't handle it now. ¹³ However, when the Spirit of Truth comes, he will guide you in all truth. He won't speak on his own, but will say whatever he hears and will proclaim to you what is to come. ¹⁴ He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and proclaim it to you. ¹⁵ Everything that the Father has is mine. That's why I said that the Spirit takes what is mine and will proclaim it to you.

MESSSAGE: "God is Still Speaking"

Any woman who has delivered a baby will tell you its painful and terrifying. Labor never happens the way the textbook says. A pregnant woman has been planning for this wonderful event for 9 months. However, when the pain gets intense, she may momentarily forget about the cute little baby she planned on. Jesus' disciples are about to be plunged into a short, sharp and intensely painful period that will be like a moment of birth. Jesus will be taken away; but they will see him again. "Not long from now, they won't see him; not long after that, they will see him again." His death and resurrection are the necessary events that will lead to his "going to the father" and his "sending of the spirit." These are extraordinary, cataclysmic events, the like of which the world has never seen before. The disciples can hardly prepare properly for them; but Jesus wants to warn them anyway. (What do you think? Would it be like finding out you were going to deliver triplets?")

It's all happening because, with Jesus' death and resurrection, a new world – THE new world – is indeed being born. That is what the author of the Gospel of John wants us to grasp. This isn't just a matter of Jesus saying "there's trouble coming, but it will be all right afterwards." It's a matter of seeing that when we find ourselves, a few chapters from now, at the foot of the cross, and then when we find ourselves after that with Mary Magdalene in the Easter garden, we shouldn't miss the significance of these events. They are not merely strange, shocking and even unique. They are the visible sign that God's new world really is being born.

It's hardly surprising, then, that Jesus has another warning as well. There are all sorts of things he would

love to talk to them about which they aren't ready for, which they couldn't cope with. As it is, they are no doubt sleepy at the end of a long day and a festive evening of Passover, and he is facing them with warnings and encouragements the like of which the world has never heard before or since.

No; they won't understand much of it just now. But part of the job of the spirit, the "helper", will be to lead them into all the truth. The spirit will also guide them, nudging their minds and imaginations into ways of knowing, and things to know, that Jesus would like to have said but couldn't at the time.

So, what do we do now? What does this have to do with us? First of all, this passage gives us a glimpse of what's coming. And then it tells us how the spirit is going to help us understand what's coming. What else? As we read through these passages, we experience the events alongside the disciples. We should walk with them through their joys and sorrows, and watch how the spirit helped them and how it can help us comprehend what God is trying to teach us and what God expects of us. Remember that Jesus said he would not leave us orphans. He didn't. He gave us God, the Holy Spirit, and Jesus. They work together to be by our side always and forever. Can you feel it? Amen.
