
#### FEMININE HYGIENE KITS

We are getting ready to send our first shipment of kits to Peru in December! Barb will be going down there to meet with doctors. No kits will be handed out, but will be stored until her trip in April.

Our next work day will be on **Tuesday**, **December 4**.

We will start at 10:00 a.m. Stay as long as you like. Come later in the day as you like or are able. The church will be open until 4:00 p.m. Here are jobs that need to be done:

- sewing/serging
- turning/pressing
- tracing/cutting
- installing snaps
- installing ribbon
- counting and packing



Hopefully you can spare some time on Dec 4. We will have additional monthly work days, on the first Tuesday of each month, until we reach our goal. If you can come and have any of the following, please bring it with you that day:

- sewing machine and usual sewing supplies
- serger
- scissors that will cut fabric
- cutting mat, ruler and rotary cutter

You do not have to have sewing skills! Just bring a sharp scissors and come. We will train you.

Thank you so much for your support so far! You have given time, talent, materials and money so that St. John can serve our neighbors in Peru. I am asking that you still keep up the gifts of underwear (girls' sizes 10, 12, 14) and cash. We are to the point that we need to survey what we have and see what is still needed.

**NOTE ABOUT JANUARY WORK DAY:** Since the first Tuesday of the month is New Year's Day, we will work on the second Tuesday, January 8.
