**Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,** Let me start by saying, “YES, I miss you all very much and I am anxious to see you as soon as it is safe.” We are certainly living in an unusual time of stay-at-home, social distance, and wearing masks. The good news is that, as far as I know, none of our church members have been ill or passed away from this virus. That tells me that our “inconvenient” practices are having a positive effect.

Just because there are no people in the building doesn’t mean your church leadership has been hibernating. Your Church Council has been meeting via Zoom on the internet. Some people are calling others to check on them. “Thinking of You” cards and other greeting cards have been going out. Nancy has been making masks. Nancy and Jan Miller are organizing a food drive for the Fairview Heights Food Pantry. (See the flyer in this newsletter.) Ginny has been picking up the mail and keeping our books straight. She also filled out all the forms to apply for the Personal Protective funds from the government. Our church application was accepted and we had money to pay our employees for 2 months.

All phone calls have been transferred to Judy at home plus she checks in with the hospitals to see if we have any members as inpatients. Bob and Steve have been mowing the lawn and checking on the building. Before the building opens again, the carpets will be professionally cleaned and the whole place sanitized as much as possible.

I have been writing worship service bulletins which include a message, for every Sunday we have not been together. Most of these are emailed out. However, we have about 20 homes who have no computers or internet. For those I have been printing out the bulletins and mailing them to those 20. I

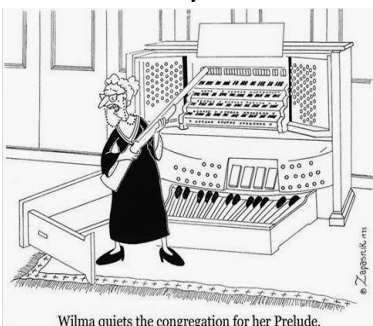


have also been keeping in touch with Rev. Shana Johnson, our Conference Pastor, and all the other pastors in Illinois South Conference, to keep up-to-date on changes concerning Covid and rules of preventing the spread from our Illinois Governor. Plus, I have started a Zoom Bible Study every Tuesday Evening at 7 pm. If you have the internet and would like to join us, send me an email.

That leads me to the next question you may have; WHEN CAN WE GO BACK TO THE CHURCH BUILDING? Our goal is to keep the building closed UNTIL ALL OF US CAN WORSHIP SAFELY. As of June 1, only 10 people can gather together. Who should we leave out? That is why we will wait until the Governor says 50 people can gather. The worship experience will not be the same as it was when we left on March 15. I mentioned those changes in the May 24 Worship Bulletin, but I'll copy that message here.

"First of all, we will all have to wear masks, all of us. Our temperatures will be taken and we will have to answer questions about our exposure to the virus. Only one door will be used for entering. Once entering the sanctuary, ushers will guide you to your seats. People will be seated in every third pew to provide 6 ft of distance and they will be seated from the first of the sanctuary to the back. They will be dismissed back to the front. You can sit only with the people you have been staying at home with.

"Hymnals and Bibles will be removed from the pews. There will be NO SINGING of hymns or the choir. Singing spreads particles from our lungs which could have the virus. Gratefully we have Sharon who can share her wonderful talents on the organ and piano. The service will be less than 45 minutes. (I know that's not a bad thing for some of you.)



"There will be no fellowship time in the L-room and no lingering in the sanctuary or narthex to chat. You are welcome to chat with each other out on the parking lot as long as you remain 6 ft apart."

My goal is to prepare you for the future. And please know, no matter what the Governor says, if YOU do not feel comfortable returning to the building just yet, that's perfectly okay. Your safety comes first! I estimate the very earliest Sunday we could open would be July 5. But that could change according to the Governor, the CDC, IDPH, etc. We'll follow whatever the science tells us.

### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

I am pleased to be able to tell you that the church applied and received assistance from the Federal Paycheck Protection Program enabling us to continue paying the full salaries of our employees. The grant does not have to be re-paid as long as the church uses the 75% of the funds to pay for salaries and 25% of the money for benefits and utilities. The grant totals \$13,039 and has to be spent in 8 weeks beginning on April 29.

I am also extremely pleased that approximately 60% of our members/friends have been supporting the church with their donations during this stressing time. Our financial status is firm and with the PPP help, we are in excellent shape.
