Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

You might have noticed that I love to learn. My philosophy is we're never too old to learn new things. I especially enjoy learning new things about our sacred writings contained in the Bible. I was recently reading a book called "Introducing the Bible" written by William Barclay. You might find that odd and think, "didn't she learn everything about the Bible when she was in seminary?" The answer is no. I believe you can read the Bible your whole life and still find new knowledge and inspiration every time you open the pages. William Barclay explains what the Gospels are and what they are not.

Dr. Barclay described the Gospels, the first four books in the New Testament, thusly, "The Gospels are not primarily historical documents; they are not intended to be regarded as biographies of Jesus. They are in fact the preaching material of the early Church. John tells us the aims of his Gospel: 'These are written that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name' (John 20:31). The aim is not to write a life of Jesus. Many of the things that we would look for in a biography are not there. There is, for instance, no description of what Jesus looked like. It is impossible to construct a time-table of the life of Jesus from the Gospels.

"It has been said that there are two ways of writing a story. You may follow the story from day to day and from hour to hour and from event to event in strict chronological order, trying to make the record as complete as possible, and trying to leave nothing out. Or, you may take a series of significant incidents and episodes and use them as windows to see into the mind and the heart of the person you are seeking to know. It is the second method that the Gospel-writers use. They make no attempt to follow Jesus from place to place and day to day.

They take a series of things he said and did to open a series of windows through which we catch glimpses of his mind and heart. It is the difference between a photograph and a portrait. A photograph shows us the subject reproduced in every detail; a portrait seizes on the special characteristics of the person being painted and brings them out. A photograph reproduces in every detail what the person looks like externally; a portrait tries to reveal his inner character and mind and heart. The Gospels are not biographies; they are not photographs; they are attempts to show the mind and the heart and the character of Jesus; and they make this attempt, not simply as a matter of interest, and not simply as a contribution to history, but so that those who read may see the mind of God in Jesus. The Gospels are not simply descriptions of Jesus; they are invitations to believe in him as the Son of God." (Pages 64-65)
